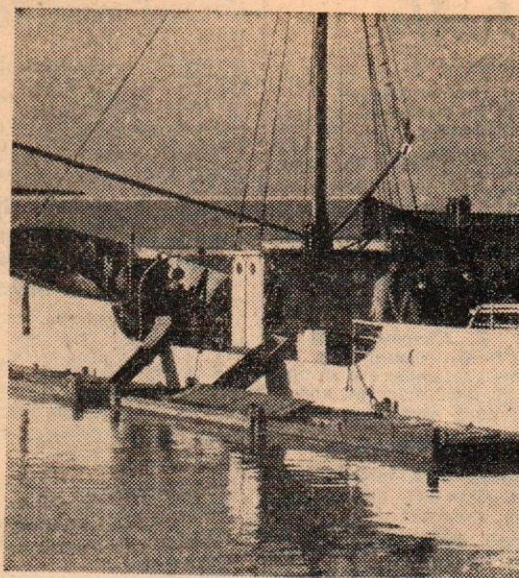

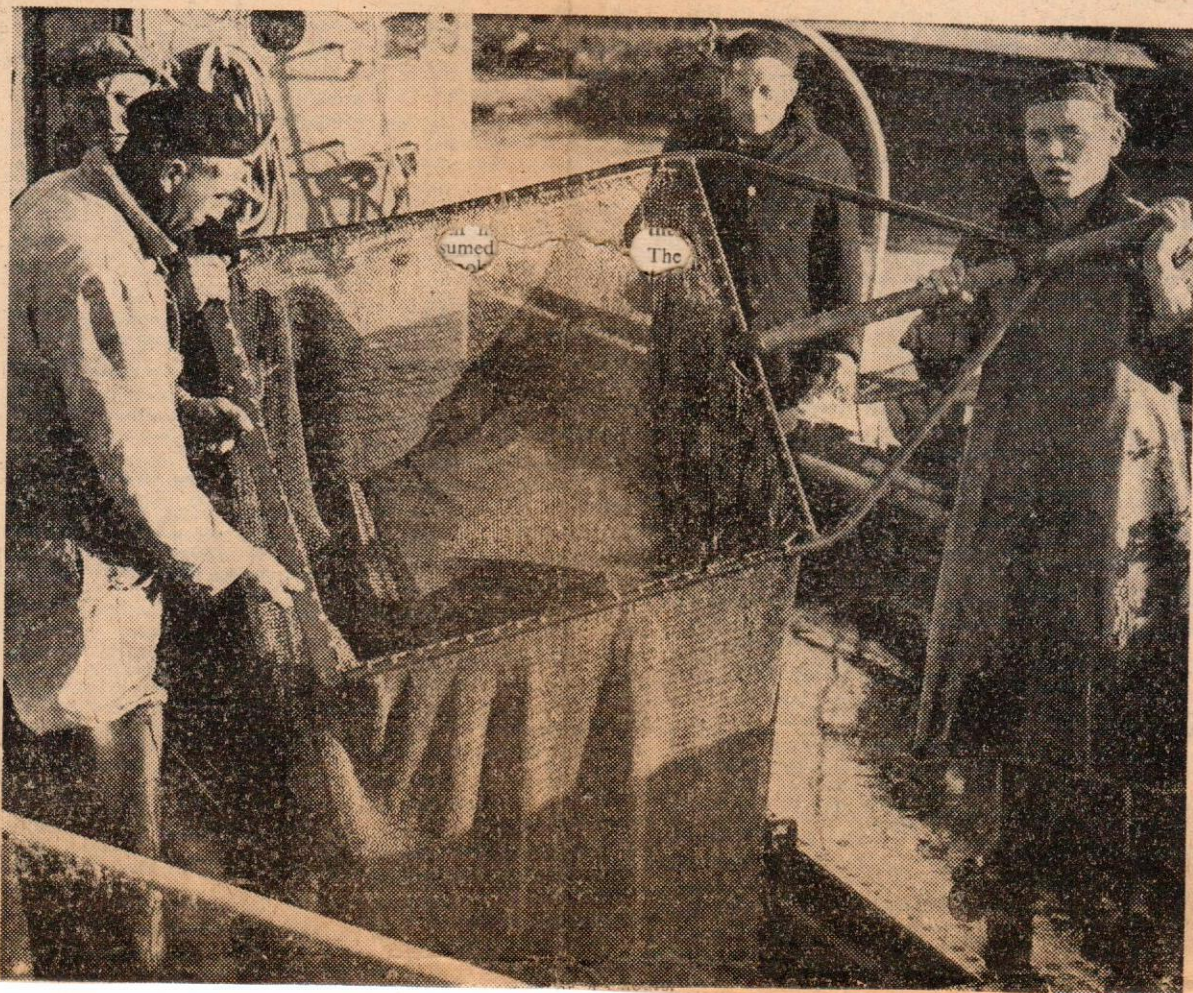

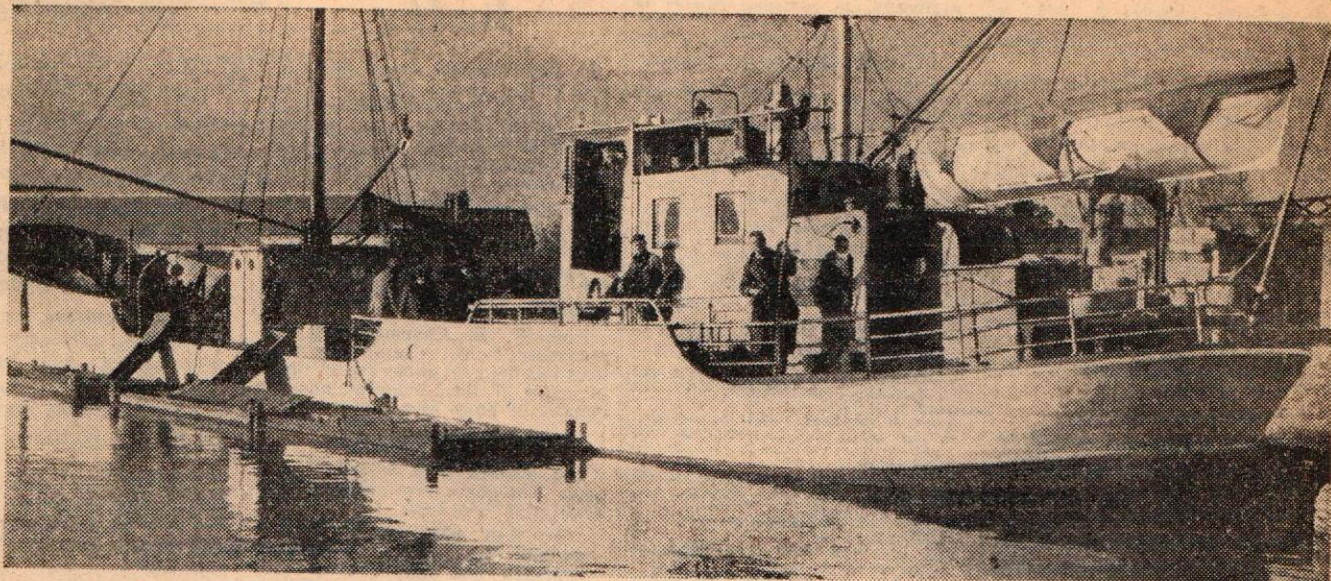

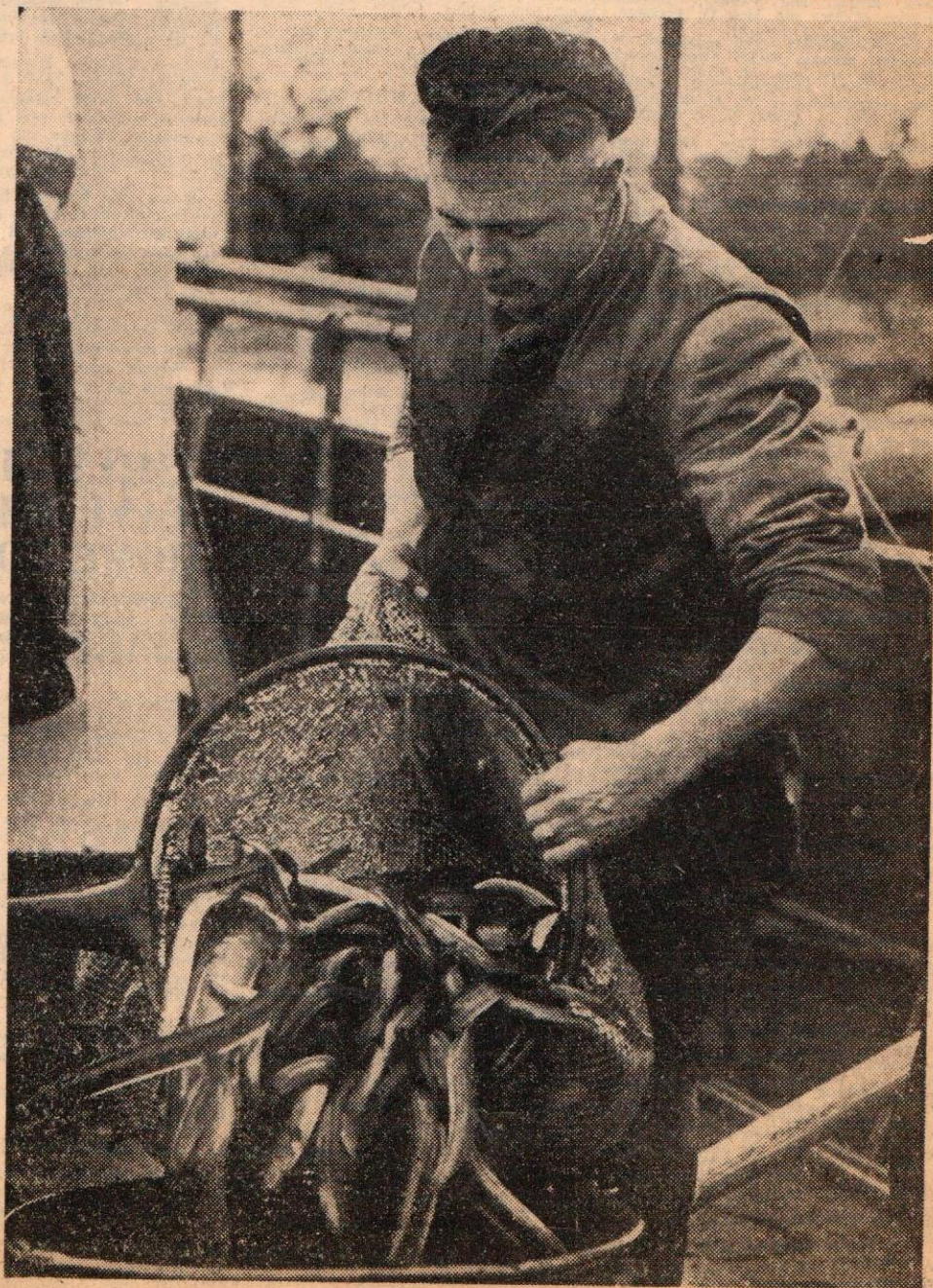
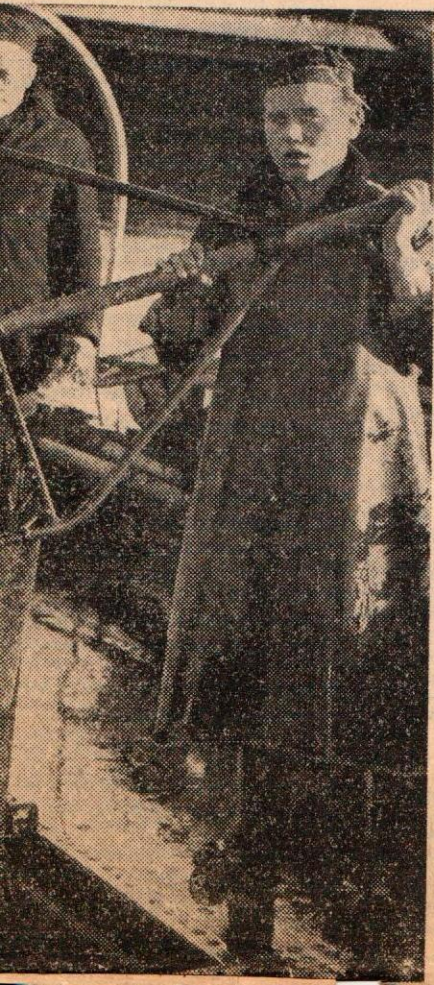

Bijschriften bij de foto's:

- Dit zijn twee van de grotere palingen. Het is een kunst om deze grote jongens vast te pakken - zelfs de experts vinden het moeilijk om ze lang vast te houden.
- Een zending arriveert vanuit Loch Neagh in Noord-Ierland. Dit is een typische palingboot, Nederlands, en heeft een kwart miljoen palingen aan boord. Naast de boot zijn de opslagtanks te zien.
- Grote netten, elk met ongeveer een ton paling, worden uit het ruim van het schip gehesen en met kleinere netten leeggeschept om ze te wegen.
- Honderden pakkisten staan klaar voor verzending. Ze bevatten elk ongeveer 36 kilo.
- Wanneer een boot arriveert, is er veel werk aan de winkel. Zo worden de palingen uit de grotere netten geschept om gewogen en in opslagtanks gelost te worden.
